ABOUT THE SCHOOL

Lakeland Christian School is located on a twenty-seven acre campus in the heart of Lakeland, Florida (Polk County). The school was established in 1954. It continues to operate as a non-denominational Christian school governed by an independent Board of Directors. Enrolling students of various abilities, the school exists to provide a challenging academic program that includes a biblical perspective on life and learning.

THE STUDENT BODY

Lakeland Christian School provides classes for students in four-year-old kindergarten through grade twelve. Total school enrollment at the beginning of the 2022-2023 school year was 1114. The elementary school enrollment, which includes K4 through grade five, is 452. Secondary school enrollment in grades six through twelve is 631. There are 97 students in the senior class. School families represent approximately 200 different local churches. The student body is made up of a cross section of social and economic groups.



FACULTY

The men and women who comprise the Lakeland Christian School faculty are Christian teachers who desire to help students learn from a biblical perspective. They come from a wide variety of educational backgrounds and work together to help prepare students for life. There are 12 administrators, 26 elementary and 51 secondary faculty members. Teachers are required to maintain current professional certification in their fields. 39 faculty out of 87 hold master's degrees and two hold doctorate degrees. 25 faculty have taught at Lakeland Christian School for ten years or more.

HIGH SCHOOL CURRICULUM

The high school program offers both standard and honors diplomas. Curricular offerings include Advanced Placement, honors and dual enrollment courses. Available electives include digital marketing, art, visual communication, robotics, law, sports medicine and culinary arts. All students must be enrolled in six to seven academic subjects each semester. One credit is equivalent to 36 weeks of instruction consisting of five, 45-minute periods per week. All courses are divided by semester. Core academic classes have comprehensive exams each semester.


GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Students have the option of earning a standard high school diploma or an honors diploma. Students working toward the standard diploma may choose from a regular or college prep track. Students on the college prep or honors diploma track must complete 26 credits in the following areas: 4 units of Bible; 4 units of English; 4 units of math; 4 units of social studies; 2 units of a world language; 3 or 4 units of science; 1 unit of physical education; 1 unit in fine/performing/practical arts; and 2 or 3 elective units.

Students on a regular track must earn 24 credits. The graduation requirements are similar to the college prep track with the exception of a world language requirement.

Students pursuing the honors diploma must complete an additional science credit; complete at least one higher level math credit; meet specific community service, GPA, and ACT/SAT score requirements; and take a specified number of AP, honors, and dual enrollment courses.







GRADING SCALE & CLASS RANK

All courses are used in computing the Grade Point Average. Students in grades 9-12 are ranked on a weighted, cumulative G.P.A. Advance Placement and dual enrollment courses are awarded an additional quality point. Honors courses receive an additional .5 quality point. The range of percentages and quality points are listed below:

TESTING

All freshmen students take the PSAT-9. Sophomore students take the PSAT-10 and the Pre-ACT. All juniors are required to take the PSAT-NMSQT. Students must take the ACT or SAT to graduate. Average test scores for the 2022 LCS graduates are listed below.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT / DUAL ENROLLMENT

LCS offers 17 Advanced Placement and 11 dual enrollment courses through Southeastern University. Students can earn up to 33 college credits through dual enrollment. Sixty percent of the Class of 2022 earned college credits.

During the 2021–2022 school year, a total of 97 students took a total of 128 AP exams. Seventy percent of the students scored a "3" or higher.

All dual enrollment coursework is offered on our campus and taught by our teachers. Southeastern University awards college credit for these courses. The RISE Institute offers high school courses in Research, Innovation, STEM Learning, and Entrepreneurship.
